70	(3) The fire codes set forth in Subsections (1) and (2) above shall constitute and shall be known
71	as the Provo City Fire Code. (Am 1989-25, Am 1992-05, Am 1995-49, Am 1999-05)
72	9.51.020. Transport Routes and Regulation of Flammable Liquid Carriers.
73	(1) Ammunition, explosives, flammable or combustible liquids, or hazardous chemicals, as the
74	same are defined in the Uniform Fire Code International Fire Code, may only be transported into
75	or within Provo City as described in this Section.
76	(2) Transportation shall be by the most direct route, which shall mean that the transporting
77	vehicle shall travel on principal transportation routes such as highway I-15, highway 89/91 or
78	highway 189 at all times except when leaving the same is necessary to make a delivery. At no
79	time shall a transporting vehicle travel through any area designated as a residential zone (R1, R2,
80	R3, R4, R5 and RM) on the Zone Map of Provo City, Utah, unless the Fire Chief Authority
81	Having Jurisdiction otherwise consents in writing, which consent shall be given only when there
82	is no practical alternative to transportation through a residential zone.
83	(3) Transportation shall only be by the use of vehicles constructed and operated as described in
84	the Uniform Fire Code and in the manner otherwise described by other applicable law, including
85	but not limited to, references therein to parking, garaging and vehicle repair.
86	(4) Flammable or combustible liquids may be transported to retail sales locations only as
87	follows:
88	(a) Delivery by tank vehicles having a capacity of more than three thousand (3,000)
89	gallons shall not be made at any location open to the public unless the tank vehicle
90	is located entirely on private property while making the delivery.
91	(b) No delivery may be made or accepted if the intake pipe for an underground
92	storage facility is within twenty (20) feet of a motor vehicle, a public street or retail
93	pumps. If the requirements of this Subsection (4)(b) cannot be met, deliveries may
94	be made only by completely closing off the business location and removing all

95	customers during the time of delivery, or by making the delivery at night between
96	the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
97	(c) When arriving for a delivery, during delivery, and when leaving thereafter, the
98	delivery vehicle shall at all times move forward and not in reverse. The Fire Chief
99	Authority Having Jurisdiction may, in writing, allow exceptions to this Subsection
100	(4)(c), but only for circumstances where it is not possible to comply with this
101	Subsection (4)(c).
102	(d) The person in charge of the delivery vehicle shall at all times during delivery
103	remain within forty (40) feet of the discharge point and in full view of the delivery
104	point.
105	(e) At the beginning of any delivery the unused capacity of the receiving tank shall
106	be one hundred twenty per cent (120%) of the maximum capacity (used or unused)
107	of the delivering tank or compartment of the delivery vehicle.
108	(5) Neither ammunition nor explosives, in amounts regulated by the Uniform Fire Code, may be
109	transported into or within Provo City without a permit therefor from the Fire Chief Authority
110	Having Jurisdiction, and then only pursuant to the terms of said permit.
111	(6) Violation of any part of this Section shall unlawful and a misdemeanor. (Enacted 1989-25)
112	9.51.030. Use of Open Flame Torches for Roofing Prohibited.
113	It shall be unlawful to use or operate, or permit the use or operation of, an open flame torch in
114	the installation or application of roofing materials on any structure within the municipal limits of
115	Provo City without the prior written approval of the Provo City Fire Chief Authority Having
116	<u>Jurisdiction</u> . (Enacted 1995-31)
117	9.51.040. Open Burnings Prohibited - Exceptions.
118	(1) Except as provided in this Section, it shall be unlawful for any person to create or permit to
119	be created an open burning of any kind.
120	(2) The following burnings are exempt from Subsection (1) of this Section:

121	(a) Upon obtaining all necessary permits, those held on property zoned as
122	"agriculture" as said term is defined in Title 14 of the Provo City Code, as
123	amended, and designated as agricultural on the Provo City Zoning Map, as
124	amended; and
125	(i) are incident to horticultural or agricultural operations of:
126	(A) prunings from trees, bushes, and plants; or
127	(B) dead or diseased trees, bushes, and plants, including stubble;
128	(ii) controlling weed growth along ditch banks incident to clearing these
129	ditches for irrigation purposes; or
130	(iii) heating of orchards or other crops to lessen the chances of their being
131	frozen so long as the emissions from this heating do not violate minimum
132	standards established by the federal "Clean Air Act" as amended and the state
133	of Utah "Air Conservation Act" as amended.
134	(b) For the purpose of outdoor cooking, contained barbecues or pits with a cooking
135	area no larger than six (6) feet in diameter.
136	(c) Other outdoor cooking facilities meeting the approval of the Fire Chief
137	Authority Having Jurisdiction.
138	(d) Other open fires, fireworks, torches or open burnings specifically allowed for
139	under another portion of the Provo City Code after obtaining any necessary
140	approval of the Fire Chief Authority Having Jurisdiction.
141	(e) Controlling weed growth along ditch banks incident to clearing these ditches for
142	irrigation purposes after obtaining any necessary approval or permit.
143	(f) Controlled burning of not more than two (2) structures per year under the direct
144	control of the Provo City Fire Department for the purpose of training fire service
145	personnel when the United States Weather Service clearing index is above 500.
146	(Enacted 1995-75)

PART II: A. If a provision of this Ordinance 2014-01 conflicts with a provision of a previously adopted ordinance concerning the same title, chapter, and/or section number amended herein, the provision in this Ordinance shall prevail. B. This ordinance and its various sections, clauses and paragraphs are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, clause or phrase is adjudged to be unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby. C. The Municipal Council hereby directs that the official copy of the Provo City Code be updated to reflect the provisions enacted by this ordinance. D. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after being posted or published as required by law. END OF ORDINANCE.
